The Bible claims repeatedly to be the Word of God (1 Samuel 9:27 and Hebrews 4:12). That means it is totally truthful and reliable because God cannot lie (Numbers 23:19 and Titus 1:2). I urge you to accept what it says for its plain sense meaning, even when you do not understand it. After all, we are called to live by faith (Habakkuk 2:4, Romans 1: 17, and Hebrews 10:38). ◆


2012 Calendar

Each year we publish a calendar featuring scenes of Israel.



A Preamble

This article is one I have been ruminating about for some time. It was about three years ago when the Lord laid the title on my heart. I began praying about it and searching the Scriptures and turning it over and over in my mind.

Finally, the message began to burn in my heart for a release, and so I decided to pull it together for presentation at our annual Bible conference.

I consider it to be a personal testimony about my faith. As such, you may not agree with what I have to say, but I hope you will respect it, even as I respect those fellow believers who would disagree with me.

Introduction

Let's get started by taking a look at the words that begin and end the Bible.

The Bible begins with these words: "In the beginning, God created the heavens and the earth" (Genesis 1:1).

The Bible ends with these words: "He [Jesus] who testifies to these things says, 'Yes, I am coming quickly.' Amen. Come, Lord Jesus" (Revelation 22:20).

The Bible begins with a revelation. The Bible ends with a promise.

Do you believe these words? Do you really believe them without reservation?

If you do, then you are an exception to the norm, for the fact of the matter is that the vast majority of professing Christians — both Catholic and Protestant, including even Evangelicals — do not accept the plain sense meaning of these verses.

The reason is that the beginning and ending of the Bible are the two most abused areas of God's Word. That's because they have been spiritualized into meaninglessness.

The Abuse of Spiritualization

For those of you who may not be familiar with the term, spiritualization, let me explain that it means to argue that the plain sense meaning of Scripture is **not** its true meaning.

Let me give you a classic example of spiritualization taken from the writings of a theologian by the name of Loraine Boettner. It has to do with his interpretation of Zechariah 14:1-9.

That passage says that in the end times Jerusalem will be surrounded by enemy forces and will be ready to fall to them when the Lord will suddenly return to the Mount of Olives. When His feet touch the Mount, it will split down the middle. The Lord will then speak a supernatural word that will instantly destroy all the enemy forces. And on that day, the Lord will become King over all the earth.

In his commentary on this passage, Boettner completely spiritualized it.¹

He argued that the Mount of Olives stands for the human heart. The enemy forces symbolize the evil in this world that surrounds and attacks the heart. The Lord's return represents what happens when a person accepts Jesus as Lord and Savior.

Thus, when Jesus comes into a person's heart, their heart (the Mount of Olives) splits in contrition, and all the evil influences in the person's life are defeated, and Jesus becomes king of that person's heart.

That's what I call an exercise in imagination!

Personal Experience

I personally know a lot about spiritualization because I grew up in a church that specialized in this perversion of Scripture. Let me give you an example, and once again, it relates to Zechariah 14, verses 1-9.

I discovered that passage when I was 12 years old, and I couldn't believe my eyes when I read it, because all the

preachers I had ever heard had been hard core Amillennialists — people who do not believe that Jesus will ever return to this earth to reign for a thousand years. Over and over I had heard these preachers proclaim, "There is not one verse in the Bible that even implies that Jesus will ever put His feet on this earth again."

Well, here was a passage that did more than imply. It said point blank that the Messiah will return to the Mount of Olives and that when His feet touch ground, the mountain will split in half!

my pastor, showed him the passage, and asked what it meant. He studied it a long time, and then he stuck his finger in my

face and said, "Son, I don't know what this passage means, but I will guarantee you one thing, it doesn't mean what it says."

Why People Spiritualize

People love to spiritualize the Scriptures because when they do so, they can make the Bible say whatever they please, and in the process they get to play God.

Most professing Christians today are members of churches whose leaders use spiritualization to play fast and loose with the beginning and ending of the Bible. The preaching and teaching they hear is based upon spiritualization, and it converts the opening chapters of the Bible into a mythical story, and the ending of the Bible into mythical promises.

The Beginning


Regarding the origins of our planet and life, the Bible plainly reveals that both were created by God in six days about 6,000 years ago.

Christendom seemed to have no problem with this revelation until the 19th Century. Scientists before that time - even the man acknowledged to be the greatest scientist in history, Sir Isaac Newton — believed the biblical story and affirmed it in their writings.

The Attack of Science

But in the 19th Century, scientists began to challenge the biblical story, reaching its culmination with Darwin's Theory of Evolution which was proposed in 1859 in his book, On the Origin of Species.²

As the 20th Century began, the Bible was on the defensive, and the battle came to a climax with the Scopes Trial in 1925 when William Jennings Bryan tried to defend the biblical view while Clarence Darrow mocked and scoffed.³

first two verses of Genesis.

There are different versions of the Gap Theory, but all versions postulate that God's original creation was most likely corrupted by the rebellion and fall of Satan. Then millions or billions of years later, God decided to bring order out of the chaos by re-creating the earth and its heavens. Some who subscribe to the Gap Theory believe that the re-creation process took only 6 literal days. But most would contend that each of the days were actually millions of years.

They thus combine the Gap Theory with the Day-Age Theory and end up with a creation process that took place over a time span of billions of years.

The Situation Today

Today, the Gap Theory, or some version of it, is held by most Christians — even Evangelicals. Many believe that God intervened at some point and created Man.

But many, if not most believe in Theistic Evolution. In other words, they believe God created all life, but that it emerged over a long period of time through a process of guided evolution.

When challenged to simply believe the creation story in the Bible, they often respond with scoffing.

Personal Experiences

I experienced this early in the history of this ministry when I was speaking to the combined adult Sunday School classes of a church in Oklahoma. I just happened to mention in passing that we should accept the Genesis story of creation to mean what it says - namely, that God created the universe and life supernaturally in six literal days some 6,000 years ago. That off-the-hand remark prompted an explosion! A man jumped to his feet and started yelling. "I can't believe that you believe such nonsense," he shouted. He then added, "It's ignorant people like you who make Christians look like fools!" At that point, he stomped out of the room.

Here's another example of what I'm talking about. In 2009 we aired a series of television programs with Dr. Jobe Martin who has a great ministry that focuses on the Creation-Evolution conflict.⁴ In one of those programs, he told why he believes the Genesis story of creation means exactly what it says.

In response to the relentless attacks scientists, Christian theologians scrambled to try to make the biblical story line up with the claim of the scientists that the universe was billions of years old and that all life had evolved haphazardly from a single source.

The Christian Response

This was accomplished primarily in one of two ways, or a combination of both.


First, was the Day-Age Theory that converted each day of the Genesis creation week into a million or more years.

The second was the Gap Theory. According to this idea, there is a gap of millions or billions of years between the In response, I received a letter from a Christian who watched the program via satellite in Latvia, one of the former Russian Baltic Republics. He wrote:

> Is the cause of Christ really advanced by having on your show a wild-eyed fanatic who cannot comprehend the concept of proof? Possibly we are not talking about the same Creator? My Lord can not lie, thus, He cannot create an old-looking earth to deceive the modern man . . . Satan's best troops in the battle to stymie Christianity are the Young Earth advocates. There are hundreds of reasons that speak of earth's age, but the wellmeaning fools refuse to learn some science before they argue against it . . . Dear sir, preach what you will but not in the name of Christianity. Do not make my Lord a deceiver and Christians an uneducated lot.

And lest you think these are isolated examples, let me point out that a group of Evangelicals have formed an organization called BioLogos whose purpose is to convince Christians that "the process of evolution is a tenable biblical position, and . . . is the best Christian apologetic to defend Genesis 1-3 against its critics."⁵

This group has actually taken the position that if Christians do not accept the theory of evolution, the Church will soon die off, because it will be rejected as "an insignificant cult."⁶



The relevance of this issue was demonstrated recently on the cover of *Christianity Today* magazine, published in June 2011.⁷

This is a magazine founded in 1956 by Billy Graham to espouse and defend biblical truths. But in recent years, it has become increasingly liberal, while still claiming to be Evangelical.

The magazine's cover featured a drawing of Adam as a Nean-

derthal looking person, and the lead article presented him as being most likely a mythical person. The article is also a shameless apologetic for Theistic Evolution.

Key Questions

Let's consider for a moment some of the key questions that are always posed by those who scoff at the Genesis account of creation:

1) How do you account for the apparent age of the earth?

2) How do you explain the fossil records?


3) How do you explain the fact that light from distant stars is reaching us — light that would have taken millions of years to arrive?

4) How do you explain the complexity of life without millions of years for it to develop?

On and on the questions go.

From a secular viewpoint, the questions appear to present an invincible argument against the biblical story. But from a faith viewpoint, they do not present insurmountable problems.

A Fundamental Principle



That's because all of these questions can be answered by one simple observation: *Special creation always carries with it the impression of age.*

Thus, if I were to create a full grown tree instantly and then reveal it to you, you would argue that it was at least 10 to 15 years old. Or, if I were to create a full grown man instantly and then introduce him to you and ask you to guess his age, you would probably say he was at least 18 years old.

In both cases, there would be an appearance of age, but it would be an illusion.

A Second Consideration

Another factor to consider is that the earth looks old because it is in bondage to decay.

The original earth was perfect, and the Bible indicates that it was encased in a thick vapor canopy and that there was lush vegetation throughout the earth (Genesis 1:6-8, 20).

But that earth was spoiled by the sin of Man. When Adam and Eve rebelled, God responded by putting a curse on the earth, and all of creation was put in bondage to decay. (If you don't believe it, just go look in a mirror!)

That second earth was then further changed radically by the Noahic Flood that suddenly created great mountains and chasms. Consider the Grand Canyon, for example. It appears to have developed as the result of millions of years of erosion. But we know from the Mount St. Helens eruption in 1980 that such canyons can be created literally overnight.⁸ They do not require great eons of time.

A Basic Issue

The lack of a need for time brings us back to a basic issue. The Bible teaches that God is omnipotent (Matthew 19:26). He could therefore have created the whole universe in the twinkling of an eye. *He did not need time*.

He chose instead to create the universe and all life in 6 days because the Bible says He wanted to give us a model for life namely, 6 days of labor followed by one day of rest.

Answering the Skeptics

Let's return now to the questions posed by the skeptics:

1) How do you account for the apparent age of the earth?

Answer: The apparent age is just that: it is apparent and not real.

The original earth looked old when it was created, and that appearance of age has been accelerated by the curse of God which put the whole universe in bondage to decay. Nor is it dishonest of God to create an earth that looks old. Again, the appearance of age is a corollary of special creation. Furthermore, God has clearly told us how He created in His Word. How can He be accused of deception when He has told us how He did it?

2) How do you explain the fossil record?

Answer: The fossil record is not a record of age. Rather, it is the record of an event — the Noahic Flood.

3) How do you explain the light of the distant stars reaching the earth?

Answer: God created the light already reaching the earth. Therefore, what we observe today through a telescope is what has been happening to those stars since 6,000 years ago when they were created.

4) How do you explain the complexity of life without millions of years for it to develop?

Answer: God doesn't need time for special creation.

Thus, when Jesus converted water into wine at the marriage feast in Cana, He did so instantly, proving He was the God of time (John 2:1-11). With God, there is no need for time.

Age Theory is that they contradict the teaching of the Bible that death did not exist until the sin of Adam and Eve. That's because both theories propose that life evolved slowly over a long period of time, and there was constant life and death long before Mankind, resulting in the survival of the fittest. That assumption of life and death before Man is directly contrary to Scripture.


Evolution

The whole theory of Evolution is the greatest fairy tale ever concocted by the depraved mind of Man.

The complexity of both the universe and life attests to intelligent design and the necessity of a Creator. To deny this is equivalent to standing in front of Mount Rushmore and saying, "Wow! Isn't it amazing what can be accomplished accidentally by erosion?"

A scientist would write off such a person as insane. Yet, that same scientist will then turn around and argue that both the universe and life evolved accidentally. It is no wonder that Ray Comfort wrote a book entitled, *You Can Lead an Atheist to Evidence, But You Can't Make Him Think.*⁹

Take, for example, the theory that the creation of the universe began billions of years ago with a Big Bang. This

Improper "Solutions"

To try to solve the contradiction between scientific theory and the biblical story by using the Gap Theory or the Day-Age Theory or both is an admission that God needs time.

One problem with the Gap Theory is that it appears to contradict Scripture. Consider this verse from Isaiah 45:18 —

For thus says the Lord, who created the heavens, (He is the God who formed the earth and made it, He established it and did not create it a waste place, but formed it to be inhabited), I am the Lord and there is none else.

God did not create the earth and then allow it to become a "waste place" for billions of years before restoring it to His original intention — as a home for Mankind.

Another problem with both the Gap Theory and the Day-

theory is based on supposed evidence that the universe is expanding.

But the Bible has an explanation for this. Eleven times we are told in the Scriptures that God "stretched out the heavens" from the point of creation. Here is one example taken from Isaiah 42:5—

Thus says God, the Lord, who created the heavens and stretched them out, who spread out the earth and what comes from it, who gives breath to the people on it and spirit to those who walk in it ... (ESV)

If the universe truly is expanding, then it is most likely left over momentum from God's stretching of the heavens.

The whole idea of the universe originating from a "big bang" explosion is preposterous. Let me ask you a simple question: How many explosions have you ever witnessed or have heard of that produced order instead of chaos?

And how many explosions have ever occurred from nothing? In that regard, I love a poster I discovered recently that pokes fun at the Big Bang Theory. It says, "In the beginning there was nothing — which exploded."

The whole idea of the universe and life originating from an explosion is as absurd as thinking — as some Evolutionists have postulated — that if you would only give 10,000 monkeys enough time, they would eventually produce the entire works of Shakespeare by randomly tapping the keys on typewriters!

Just a Theory

And concerning The Theory of Evolution, it is just that a theory. The scientific method requires observation. No scientists were present to observe the creation of the universe or life. The only one who was present has revealed to us in His Word how it happened.

The reality is that the advocates of the Theory of Evolution have been running for cover ever since the discovery of DNA and its incredible complexity. Thus, Richard Dawkins, one of the world's leading evolutionists, recently said that his current best guess is that life on earth either came here floating on crystals in space, or else it was planted here by aliens.¹⁰

The bottom line is that these so-called scientists are unwilling to admit the existence of a Creator God because then they would be responsible to someone.

The Bible sums it up best. In the Old Testament it says, "The fool has said in his heart, 'There is no God'" (Psalm 14:1). In the New Testament it says: "Even though they [speaking of ungodly people] knew God, they did not honor Him as God . . . but they became futile in their speculations . . . Professing to be wise, they became fools" (Romans 1:21-22).

The Days of Genesis 1

Let's return to the biblical text. We are told in Genesis 1 that God created the universe and life in six days and then rested on the seventh. How do we know they were six twenty-four hour days? The answer is simple. We know the text is speaking of 24 hour days, because it says so! Each day is described literally as an "evening and a morning."

The fact that the Genesis account is speaking of 24 hour days is affirmed in Exodus 20:8-11 —

- 8) Remember the Sabbath Day, to keep it holy.
- 9) Six days shall you labor and do all your work,
- 10) But the seventh day is a Sabbath of the Lord your God; in it you shall not do any work.
- 11) For in six days the Lord made the heavens and the earth, the sea and all that is in them, and rested on the seventh day . . .

6,000 Years of History

And how do we know all this happened only about 6,000 years ago? Because the biblical genealogies going back to Adam and Eve cover a time span of only 6,000 years from today's time.

And Jesus Himself said in Mark 10:6 that the beginning of creation dates from Adam and Eve: "... from the beginning of the creation, God made them male and female."

In this regard, I think it is interesting to note that the Bible is the only written account of human civilization that provides historical information before the flood of Noah

that took place some 4,300 years ago. All other records of human history, such as the Chinese and Egyptian, date back only to the time of the flood.

Carbon Dating

But what about carbon dating? Hasn't it revealed human skeletons much older than 6,000 years, as well as animals like dinosaurs that are even millions of years old?

The problem with carbon dating is that it is based on evolutionary assumptions — the primary one being the principle of uniformitarianism, which is the scientific theory that life on earth has been uniform ever since the beginning and therefore the carbon content in the atmosphere has always been the same.

Even those who put their faith in carbon dating will admit that if there ever was a world-wide flood, then all carbon-dating is inaccurate. But they deny the occurrence of any such worldwide catastrophe, even though there is overwhelming evidence of it throughout the earth and there are references to it in the folk lore of all ancient civilizations.

Science Book

Some skeptics respond at this point by saying, "The Bible is not a science book, so we cannot take seriously what it says about scientific matters."

It is true that the Bible is not a science book, but it is also true that when the Bible speaks about scientific matters, it speaks with authority and truth. In fact, it would be impossible for the Bible to contradict true science because God is the author of both.


Below are listed some examples of scientific truth that can be found in the Bible, and these examples are only a few of those that could be cited. All these scientific principles were expressed in the Bible long before they were "discovered" by scientists.

- 1) The earth is a sphere suspended in space (Isaiah 40:22 and Job 26:7)
- 2) Atmospheric circulation (Eccl. 1:6)
- 3) Ocean currents (Psalm 8:8)
- 4) The hydraulic cycle (Isaiah 55:10)

- 5) Life is in the blood (Leviticus 17:11)
- 6) The First Law of Thermodynamics (2 Peter 3:7, 13) this is the law of the conservation of mass and energy that was not discovered until 1850.
- 7) The Second Law of Thermodynamics (Romans 8:21) all of creation is in bondage to decay. (Also discovered in 1850.)
- 8) Basic laws of hygiene (Leviticus 11-15)

Regarding the final point above, the basic laws of hygiene outlined by Moses in the book of Leviticus were far superior to anything practiced in ancient times, whether in Egypt or anywhere else.

During the period of the Great Plague in Europe in the 14th Century, the Jews were often blamed for it because their infection rate was far less than the general public. But their seeming immunity was due to the practice of the Mosaic laws of hygiene. (Keep in mind that this was a time in history when people took baths only once a year — and then, only if they really needed one!)



To further illustrate how far ahead of science the hygienic laws of the Bible were, consider the incredible story of Ignaz Semmelweis.¹¹ He was an Hungarian doctor who was practicing medicine in Vienna in 1847 when he noticed the high rate of infection and death in the obstetrics ward. He observed that the doctors were performing vaginal exams after having done autopsies. Assuming they were transferring something from the dead bodies, he suggested they start washing their hands after completing the autopsies. This resulted in a

dramatic improvement, but the idea was still rejected by the medical community as nonsense. He died before the germ theory of disease was developed in the 1860's by Louis Pasteur and Joseph Lister.¹²

So What?

Some of you may be thinking at this point, "So what? What difference does it make how the Genesis record of Creation is interpreted?"

Let me assure you that it makes a lot of difference.

For one thing, the integrity of the Bible as the Word of God is at stake. For example, if we cannot believe what the Bible says about the Creation, then how can we believe what it says about the Resurrection? Or what it says about the return of Jesus?

And that brings me to the ending of the Bible.

The Ending

Like the Beginning, the Ending of God's Word has been spiritualized into meaning anything except what it says.

The viewpoint of End Times that prevails in the Church today — both Catholic and Protestant — is Amillennialism, the belief that there will never be a millennial reign of Jesus on this


earth.

This view is based on a spiritualization of Scripture.

The Biblical View

The Bible says point blank Jesus will return to this earth to reign for a thousand years (Revelation 20:4). It further states that Satan will be bound during that time (Revelation 20:1-3), and that the earth will be flooded with peace, righteousness and justice as the waters cover the seas (Isaiah 9:6-7 & Isaiah 11:9).

The Bible also teaches that at the end of that reign, this earth will be consumed with fire and out of that fiery inferno will come a new earth that will serve as the eternal home of the Redeemed (2 Peter 3:12-13 and Revelation 21:1). It also teaches that God will come down to earth and that the Redeemed will live in glorified bodies in His presence forever (Revelation 21:2-4).




The Amillennial View

The Amillennial viewpoint spiritualizes all of this.

It argues that the Millennium began at the Cross with the binding of Satan and that the Millennium continues to this day with Jesus reigning from Heaven through His Church. In other words, the Church Age is the Millennium. There is no Rapture in this viewpoint, nor is there any Great Tribulation.

Most Amillennialists would further argue that when Jesus returns, He will simply appear and then take all believers, both living and dead, back to Heaven with Him to live eternally in an ethereal spirit world.



The problems with this view are overwhelming.

1) If we are in the Millennium now, why isn't the world flooded with peace, righteousness and justice?

2) If Jesus is reigning now, why is He doing such a poor job? After all, every nation in the world is in rebellion against Him. And if He is reigning now as King of kings, then why does the Bible portray Him instead as our High Priest before God's throne? (Hebrews 3:1 and Hebrews 4:14-16).

The Bible says Jesus came the first time as our Savior. He currently serves as our High Priest. He will return as our King of kings.

3) If Satan is bound now, then why does evil abound in the world, and why do Scriptures written long after the Cross portray

him as continuing to be the ruler of this world?

Furthermore, the Bible says Satan is going to be bound in a special way during the Millennium. He will be restrained so that he can no longer deceive the nations of the world. Yet, everywhere we look today, we see nations deceived.

4) What would God have to do to convince us that Jesus is returning to reign for a thousand years?

Repeatedly throughout the Old Testament we are told that the Messiah will reign over all the world from Mount Zion in Jerusalem (Isaiah 2:1-4; Isaiah 9:6-7; Daniel 7:13-14, 18, 27; and Micah 4:1-7). And in chapter 20 of the book of Revelation we are told six times that His reign will last 1,000 years.

5) Finally, how do you explain eternity in an ethereal world as a spirit being when the Bible says we will live forever in glorified bodies on a new earth? (Revelation 21:1-7).

Furthermore, when it comes to the interpretation of prophecy, there is a fundamental fact that must be kept in mind namely, all First Coming prophecies were literally fulfilled in their plain sense meaning. Why, then, would the Second Coming prophecies be any different?

Conclusion

The bottom line is that we need to stop playing games with God's Word. We need to accept it for what it says — and stop trying to make excuses for it.

Hundreds of times, in both the Old Testament and the New Testament, the claim is made that the writers of the Bible are speaking the Word of God (1 Samuel 9:27 and Hebrews 4:12). If so, then what they wrote must be without error, for God cannot lie, nor can He make mistakes.

I therefore challenge you to accept the Bible for what it

Interpretation

It all comes down to a matter of interpretation.

As with the interpretation of the beginning of the Bible, the interpretation of the ending depends upon whether you are going to accept the plain sense meaning of the text or whether you are going to insist on spiritualizing the text to mean what you want it to mean.

I believe the fundamental rule for the interpretation of all the Bible, from beginning to end should be what I call the Golden Rule of Interpretation:

If the plain sense makes sense, don't look for any other sense, lest you end up with nonsense.

claims to be — the Word of God — and I challenge you to believe it for what it says.

And I want to conclude by emphasizing that my challenge to you to accept the Bible for what it claims to be, and to believe it for what it says, is a challenge that comes directly from Jesus Christ Himself. Here is what He is recorded as saying in John 5:46-47:

> ... if you believed Moses, you would believe Me, for he wrote about Me. But if you do not believe his writings, how will you believe My words?

Moses was the one who wrote the book of Genesis. We need

to believe what he wrote.

Your Christian faith will have full meaning only when you believe that the universe and the life it contains was supernaturally created by God for a purpose.

And you will never experience the fullness of Christian hope until you start believing the promises of God's Prophetic Word.

The Beginning and the Ending —

May God forgive us for ignoring them.

May God forgive us for abusing them.

May God forgive us for playing games with them.

May we commit ourselves to their revival in the teaching and preaching programs of our churches.

God was there at the beginning. He will be there at the end. He holds the whole universe in His hands. Let us find peace in the knowledge that He is sovereign.



The Problem of Starlight

Creation Ministries

Dr. David R. Reagan

There are a number of very fine ministries that focus on the issue of creation versus evolution. The ones I am recommending below are those that I am personally acquainted with. All of them are thoroughly biblically based, and as such, they teach a young earth and the supernatural creation of life.

The Institute for Creation Research



This is the oldest of the creation ministries. It was founded in 1970 by Dr. Henry Morris, who is considered to be the father of the modern day creation movement. He was serving as a professor of hydraulic engineering at the Virginia Polytechnic Institute and State University in 1961 when he published the book, *The Genesis Flood*, which presented scientific reasoning for a young earth, the supernatural creation of life, and the historicity of

the Noahic Flood. Dr. Morris died in 2006, and the operation of the ministry was taken over by his two sons, John Morris and Henry Morris III. In 2007 the ministry was moved from the San Diego area to Dallas, Texas. The ministry publishes a great variety of educational materials designed for all age groups. The ICR website can be found at www.icr.org.

Answers in Genesis

This is the largest and perhaps the most influential of all the creation ministries. It was founded by Dr. Ken Ham, an Australian who moved to the United States in 1987. After working for ICR for several years, he founded AIG in 1994. The ministry is located in Petersburg,

Kentucky (just south of Cincinnati). They recently opened a Creation Museum that has attracted over one million visitors in its first three years of operation. They are currently building a full scale model of Noah's Ark. Dr. Ham has a daily radio program called "Answers with Ken Ham." It is broadcast on more than 900 stations in the United States.

I have only one reservation about this ministry, and that is the fact that Dr. Ham has publicly stated that it makes no difference to him what people believe about end time Bible prophecy. I wrote and asked what he would think if I were to say that it made no difference to me what people believe about the origin of the universe and life. I am still waiting for an answer. The leaders of all the rest of the creation ministries featured on this page believe in a literal, plain-sense interpretation of end time Bible prophecy. The Creation Truth Foundation

This ministry, located in Noble, Oklahoma, was founded in 1989 by Dr. Thomas Sharp who holds science degrees from Purdue University and the University of Oklahoma. He has been a science educator since 1964. Dr. Sharp is a much sought after conference speaker who delights audiences with the use of many object lessons. He is a skilled educator who serves as editor-in-chief of a Bible based science curriculum called "Truth in

Biblical Discipleship Ministries



Dr. Jobe Martin is the founder of this ministry that is based in Rockwall, Texas, a suburb of Dallas. He is a graduate of the University of Pittsburgh Dental School. He was teaching at the Baylor College of Dentistry when a student challenged his allegation that teeth had evolved from fish scales! He accepted the challenge, and his study led him to reject evolution — a story he tells in his best-selling book, *The Evolution of a Creationist*. Dr. Martin gave up his career in

dentistry and entered Dallas Theological Seminary. In 1984 he founded BDM Ministries, which focuses on the teaching of Creationism. He has produced a series of highly innovative videos called, "Incredible Creatures That Defy Evolution." His ministry's website can be found at http://biblicaldiscipleship.org.

Creation Training Initiative

The newest of the creation ministries is this one founded by Mike Riddle. It was established earlier this year, and is based in Hebron, Kentucky. The ministry may be new, but its founder has been involved in creation ministry for over 30 years. Mr. Riddle holds degrees in Mathematics and Education. Prior to getting involved in creation ministry, he was a captain in the U.S. Marines and a national champion in track and field. His business career included managing both U.S. Sprint and Microsoft's world-wide

He serves as an adjunct speaker for AIG, and he is a featured speaker at the Steeling the Mind Conferences sponsored by Compass Ministries. How I Lost Faith in Evolution

(Editor's note: Dr. Hugg earned B.S. and M.S. degrees in physics at California Institute of Technology. His doctorate is in nuclear physics and was earned at Stanford University. After serving for ten years as a research physicist for Shell Oil and British Petroleum, he decided to change careers and focus on the field of medicine. He received a post-doctoral fellowship in medical imaging from the University of California in San Francisco. He

then served in academic positions with The Henry Ford Health Science Center in Detroit and the University of Alabama in Birmingham. After discovering his Jewish heritage, he decided to emigrate to Israel, together with his Jewish wife, Susan, and their two children. He became an Israeli citizen and went to work for General Electric Global Research in Haifa, focusing on the development of MRI technology. He currently serves as vice president and chief technology officer at Gamma Medical-Ideas in Northridge, California. He and his family attend Shepherd of the Hills Church in Porter Ranch. Dr. Hugg has been the recipient of many prestigious scientific awards and research grants. He currently serves as vice president of the Lamb & Lion Board of Trustees.)

As a child, I believed in Santa Claus, the Easter Bunny, the Tooth Fairy, God, and the Bible. When I discovered that Santa Claus, the Easter Bunny, and the Tooth Fairy were lies, I suspected that God and the Bible were lies, too. As I approached adolescence, I read many science books and developed a skeptical attitude about the supernatural.

As a Boy Scout I worked to earn the God and Country award by volunteering my service in my family's mainline church. I questioned the pastor about the authenticity of the Bible, the divinity of Jesus, and the existence of God. He cynically denied them all and said his ministry was to offer the congregation psychological help to cope with life and feel better about themselves!

Rejecting God

I was 13 when I rejected God, declared myself an atheist, and enthusiastically embraced Evolution as my worldview. My humanistic textbooks and teachers further convinced me that the Bible was an invention of ruling men who wanted to control the uneducated multitude. I frequently quoted Karl Marx who proclaimed, "Religion is the opiate of the masses." The Bible was supposedly full of mythology, superstition, and contradictions a compilation of legends taken from many cultures.

I ridiculed Christians and persecuted them for believing imaginary nonsense. I competed successfully in several high school debate and oratory tournaments, winning first place trophies by delivering a dramatic (although mocking) rendition of Jonathan Edward's famous sermon "Sinners in the Hands of an Angry God," earning for myself the facetious nickname "Reverend."

Turning Points

Two events caused me to question atheistic Evolution while I was studying physics at the California Institute of Technology (CalTech). The motto of CalTech is "The truth shall set you free" (although the quote is never attributed to Jesus).

The first event was the sudden death of my father. He was killed in a gas-well explosion on my 18th birthday, which led me at his funeral to begin to wonder if there might be life after death.

The second turning point came during my sophomore year. I took a biology course called "Topics in Evolution Theory." It was taught by Nobel Prize winner Max Delbrück. He frankly told the class that the Bible offered a simpler explanation of the scientific observations related to the origin of life and the universe. However, he rejected the biblical account simply because of his worldview that there was nothing supernatural in the universe.

He claimed that no scientist could even entertain the possibility of the supernatural. He had tremendous faith that natural science would eventually explain the universe as the result of a Big Bang followed by the spontaneous formation of galaxies, stars, planets, and life — evolving all the species living and extinct over billions of years guided only by natural selection from random mutations of DNA. Professor Delbrück revealed in his course that the Theory of Evolution is full of holes, is contradicted by many facts, and is based on blind faith in the non-existence of God.

I rejected Professor Delbrück's claim that a scientist could not consider the possibility of the supernatural. In contrast, I believed that true science is the pursuit of truth, wherever that pursuit leads, even to consider the supernatural.

Competing Worldviews

As a result of that class in Evolution, I re-examined God and the Bible. In the process I discovered that many reputable scientists believe that the Bible provides a better explanation of the facts of nature about the origin of the universe and life on earth. The two worldviews, Evolution and Creation, provide opposing explanations of these facts. Both worldviews are scientific and both are also religious.

The order and beauty of the universe are either evidence of billions of years of gradual godless evolution, or they are evidence for the work of a Creator. I decided that it takes much more faith to believe in godless Evolution than to believe in the well-supported biblical account of Creation by God. I lost faith in Evolution, renounced atheistic humanism, and accepted God, His Bible, and His account of Creation as the truth in June of 1972.

Growing in Faith

Over the past four decades, I have continued to find evidence of the truth of God's Word, and my faith in God and His Son, our Messiah continues to grow. I am convinced that the Genesis account is true and more plausibly explains life and the universe than the Theory of Evolution. I have found the Bible to be accurate in all fields of science, including physics, medicine, and archaeology.

I do not have space here to explain Creation Science,^{*} but I recommend to parents and children the publications of the Institute for Creation Research. They have outstanding publications for all levels, pre-school through college.

The contradictions I once thought filled the Bible have evaporated as my understanding of God's Word has grown. I believe that many cultures have borrowed from the truth of the Bible to shape their myths and superstitions. I believe that the recently discovered "Bible Codes" confirm the supernatural origin of the Bible and emphasize the importance of believing the plain sense meaning of this incredible "love letter from God." Most importantly, God has transformed my life and proven to me His existence and His love for His creation. I can see His hand at work daily. The instructions for life given by our Creator God are reliable and good.

Finally, I am impressed by the fact that multitudes of Bible prophecies have been fulfilled with 100% accuracy. And I am confident that the remaining Bible prophecies will be fulfilled precisely and completely as "the Lord has declared."

Confidence in God's Word

I too am confident that God's Word is absolute truth from Genesis through Revelation. God is the Creator and Sustainer of the Universe; He is the loving Father who sent His only Son to be the Savior of His creation; He is the Righteous Judge who will one day judge His rebellious creation and send His Son back to Earth as King of kings and Lord of lords to reclaim it and establish a reign of perfect peace, justice, and righteousness.

Just as God's Prophetic Word foretold exactly the events surrounding Messiah's first advent, the same Word is clear about His second advent. He will come precisely as He said He would.

Maranatha, come quickly, Lord! •



Learning From My Students

Dr. Jobe Martin, D.D.

(Editor's note: The essay below is excerpted from Dr. Martin's outstanding book, *The Evolution of a Creationist*. It is available from our ministry for \$15 plus the cost of shipping. Dr. Martin earned his dental degree from the University of Pittsburgh Dental School. He later earned a Th.M. degree from Dallas Theological Seminary.)



Frustration was not an adequate word to describe my feelings! Which was true evolution and billions of years, or creation in six 24-hour days? Two of my students at Baylor College of Dentistry had challenged me to investigate the possibility that the God of the Bible had created everything in six 24- hour days, as described in the first chapter of Genesis. My first reaction was, "Only an ignorant fool would believe in those ancient myths of the Book of Genesis."

I was an evolutionist. My

years as a biology major at Bucknell University and a dental major at the University of Pittsburgh had convinced me that we are here because of evolutionary processes —all very logical and explainable through the Scientific Method.

This was A.D. 1971! We were living in the days of modern, hi-tech-science, which had claimed proof of evolution to be true. And yet, these two dental students were brilliant young men. They held advanced degrees in the sciences. Surely, there must be a simple way to prove that their six-day view of creation was wrong.

One of the questions those two dental students asked me was this: "Doctor Martin, have you ever heard of the concept of God creating things with the appearance of age?" At that point in my pilgrimage, I certainly had not, but it sparked a desire to learn more . . .

A Radical Transformation in Thinking

As I talked with those Baylor students, I began to realize that evolutionary theory and the Biblical creation account cannot be merged. The belief that God used evolutionary processes or even successive creations over extended periods of time to change primitive molecules into you and me (Macroevolution, Theistic Evolution, Progressive Creation) is inadequate.

It portrays a vicious, stupid God who needed millions of years of ferocious animals eating animals or "survival of the fittest," to produce something He considered perfect enough to announce that man was finally in His own image. Evolution destroys God, His infinite power and His image. Furthermore, evolution enslaves God to the restrictive boundaries of time and robs Him of His glory (Isaiah 48:11).

Educational Insanity

In July of this year the State Legislature of California passed a bill mandating the public schools to teach the contributions of lesbian, gay, bisexual and transgendered individuals. Governor Jerry Brown signed the bill imme-

diately and praised it. The bill requires the rewriting of textbooks to present the LGBT community in a positive light. It applies to K-12 students. This means that children as young as 5 years old will be taught that sexual perversion is normal and okay and even to be celebrated. Thankfully, the Pacific Justice Institute worked quickly behind the scenes and, together with several profamily organizations, has launched a referendum to allow voters to directly repeal the legislation. Under California law, that means the new law is automatically suspended. The referendum supporters have 90 days to garner 500,000 valid signatures to get the repeal on the ballot. Pray for their success.

Presidential Blasphemy

President Barack Obama declared the month of June to be "National Lesbian, Gay, Bisexual, and Transgender (LGBT) Pride Month," as he has done annually since his election. Who would ever have dreamed that an American President would ask the nation to celebrate sexual perversion? For the third time, Dr. Reagan wrote to the President asking why he had omitted prostitutes, pedophiles, and those who practice bestiality. In response to the President's decadent

A group of one hundred Christian ministers in the Omaha, Nebraska area recently signed a proclamation declaring that homosexuality is not a sin. The signers included ministers from Lutheran, Episcopalian, United Church of Christ, United Methodist, and Presbyterian churches. In other words, they were representatives of the old mainline denominations that have been bleeding to death over the past 40 years, and which will continue to do so as they thumb their noses at God's Word. Who do these ministers think they are? By what reasoning do they think they have the right to deny the clear teaching of the Bible that the only sex that is moral is sex between a married man and woman? How can they have the audacity to approve a sexual perversion that is clearly condemned in both the Old and New Testaments? In fact it is a sin so grievous that the Bible says point blank that those who practice it "will not inherit the kingdom of God" (1 Corinthians 6:9-10). These apostate Christian leaders are loving homosexuals into Hell by not calling them to repent, and in the process they are condemning their own souls.



Urban Madness

A judge has ruled that a ban on circumcision cannot appear on the ballot in the San Francisco city elections in November. The measure would have prohibited circumcision among males under the age of 18. Any viola-

Seeker-Friendly Nonsense

One of our nation's most prominent Christian ministries has decided to take Christ out of its name. Campus Crusade for Christ has announced that it is changing its name to "Cru," which prompted many to ask, "What is a 'Cru'?" The vice president of the ministry stated, "We felt like our name was getting in the way of accomplishing our mission." He went on to explain that researchers had found that 9 percent of Christians and 20 percent of non-Christians were alienated by the name Campus Crusade for Christ.

This incredible decision is part of a nation-wide movement to make Christianity more "seeker-friendly." New church buildings are being built to look more like office complexes than churches. The cross is being removed from steeples and from interior decorations. And names are being changed. For example, Bible Churches, which once were considered to be bedrock Evangelical institutions, are now dropping the word, Bible, from their names for fear that the very mention of God's Word might scare people away.

All this posturing ignores the fact that the Bible teaches that although both Christ and the Cross will always be offensive to the unsaved because they are convicting of sin, we are to proclaim them anyway because people need to be convicted of their sins. The Apostle Paul wrote: "The word of the cross is to those who are perishing foolishness, but to us who are being saved it is the power of God" (1 Corinthians 1:18). We don't need to pander to people, we need to confront them with their sin and their need for a Savior.

Interpretation of Prophecy

J.C. Ryle (1816-1900), the Bishop of Liverpool, was considered the best man in the Church of England by Baptist pastor Charles Spurgeon. He was a man of the Word who interpreted Bible prophecy literally. The following is from his book, *Are You Ready for the End of Time?* (1867):

"I believe we have cherished an arbitrary, reckless habit of interpreting first advent texts literally, and second advent texts spiritually. I believe we have not rightly understood 'all that the prophets have spoken' about the second personal advent of Christ, any more than the Jews did about the first . . . But suppose the Jew asks you if you take all the prophecies of the Old Testament in their simple literal meaning. Suppose he asks you if you believe in a literal personal advent of Messiah to reign over the earth in glory, a literal restoration of Judah and Israel to Palestine, a literal rebuilding and restoration of Zion and Jerusalem. Suppose the unconverted Jew puts these questions to you, what answer are you prepared to make? Will you dare to tell him that Old Testament prophecies of this kind are not to be taken in their plain literal sense? Will you dare to tell him that the words Zion, Jerusalem, Jacob, Judah, Ephraim, and Israel, do not mean what they seem to mean, but mean the Church of Christ? Will you dare to tell him that the glorious kingdom and future blessedness of Zion, so often dwelt upon in prophecy, mean nothing more than the gradual Christianizing of the world by missionaries and gospel preaching? Will you dare to tell him that you think it 'carnal' to expect a literal rebuilding of Jerusalem, 'carnal' to expect a literal coming of Messiah to reign? Oh, reader, if you are a man of this mind, take care what you are doing! I say again, take care." 💠

A Tribute to a Great Man of God

Dr. David R. Reagan

A dear friend and ministry colleague, Ron Carlson, was called home to his Creator on June 16, 2011. He died peacefully in his sleep while taking a nap before dinner. His death was sudden and totally unexpected. He was only 61 years old. He is survived by his wife, Marge, and by two sons, Jason and Jared. His sons are both ordained ministers and will be taking over the direction of the great ministry that God developed through their dad.

Ron's ministry, called Christian Ministries International, was founded in 1975. The name proved to be prophetic because Ron taught and preached the Word of God in a total of 90 nations on six continents before his death. The ministry, which his capable sons will continue, focuses on evangelism and apologetics. The ministry's theme verse is Jude 3: "Contend earnestly for the faith."

And that's exactly what Ron did in his writings, teachings, and sermons. He had an overwhelming passion for the Word of God — for studying it, proclaiming it, and defending it. At the time of his death, he was deeply concerned about the fast-growing and swiftly-spreading apostasy in the Church.

Ron was one of the gentlest, kindest persons I have ever known. He had great compassion for the victims of spiritual deception, and he had an overwhelming zeal to reach them with the Gospel. I had the privilege of ministering with Ron at many conferences. He was one of the featured speakers at our annual Bible conference in 2009. On two occasions, he came to our headquarters to be interviewed for television programs. During those memorable visits, we recorded a total of six programs which were later published as two video albums, one on the cults and the other on the major world religions.


We have always stocked his remarkable book, *Fast Facts on False Teachings*. It contains an overview summary of the beliefs of the major Christian cults and the leading world religions.

The Body of Christ is going to greatly miss the truthspeaking voice of Ron Carlson. Let us pray for his mantle to be passed to his sons.





Shooting in Israel

In mid-July Dr. Reagan took a video crew to Israel to shoot television programs. They worked five days and were able to shoot five complete programs and parts of two others. The days were long and hot and the work was exhausting, but the Lord greatly blessed the effort.

Four of the programs focused on the mountains of Jerusalem — the Mount of Olives, the Temple Mount, Mount Zion and Mount Herzl. Dr. Reagan conducted a tour of the major sites on each mountain and then concluded the programs by talking about the prophetic significance of the mountains. The fifth program was a walking tour of the Old City.

The video crew visited two graves for the first time. One was the grave of Eliezer ben Yehuda on the Mount of Olives. He is the man who single-handedly resurrected the Hebrew language from the dead. The other grave was located on Mount Zion. It was the grave of Horatio Spafford, the 19th Century Chicago businessman who wrote the great hymn, "It Is Well With My Soul."

A Very Blessed Bible Conference

He was followed by James Walker, president of Watchman Fellowship, one of Christendom's foremost cult watching ministries. - **Bill Koenig:** "The United States and Israel." Bill is a White House correspondent who publishes a weekly news report about international events called "Koenig's Watch."
- **Gary Frazier:** "The Salvation of Israel." Gary is the founder and director of Discovery Worldwide Ministries. He has been to Israel more than 100 times and is considered an expert on Middle East politics.


